## Chairman's Message

The Children's Hospital Foundation of Saskatchewan is dedicated to enhancing the medical care and treatment of children across this province by directing funds to patient care services through education, research, equipment and the much anticipated new Children's Hospital of Saskatchewan in cooperation with our many partners like the Saskatoon Health Region. The 2009 year will be remembered as a historical year after coming off of the momentum of the Mike Weir's Miracle Drive for Kids event held in Saskatoon in 2008. Supporters, stakeholders and management received the long awaited confirmation that a Provincial hospital for children would become a reality with the Government of Saskatchewan's 2009 budget announcement committing unequivocally \$200 million to maternal and pediatric care. This news was not only instrumental in reaffirming the mandate of the Foundation, it was the catalyst of additional support to our Foundation including the largest individual gift ever made to a Pediatric Hospital in Western Canada last October by Leslie and Irene Dubé. Ongoing and

important annual donations through our many Children's Hospital Foundation events, complimented major contributions from the Knights of Columbus, John and Sonya Remai, and the Colonel Sanders Foundation rounding off what was nothing less than a tremendous year for the Children's Hospital Foundation of Saskatchewan.

With the increased community work and stewardship ahead of us, the Board of Directors of the Foundation added five new Board members. These new prominent leaders in our community will add valuable guidance in the days ahead to an existing Board of dedicated, long standing men and women. I want to thank the new Board members for agreeing to support the future vision of this Foundation. To the Board colleagues who have been involved with the Foundation for many, many years, the hard working and dedicated management team, and to our loyal supporters your commitment to the Children in the Province of Saskatchewan experienced major milestones in 2009. ## A Second Opinion

A tertiary level Maternity Care Centre such as the one at Royal University Hospital (RUH) is equipped to handle the sickest of pregnant women as well as provide routine delivery care. This site also acts as the referral centre for complicated pregnancies from northern Saskatchewan and at times all of Saskatchewan. The staff has years of experience, is dedicated to the provision of exemplary care and is highly trained to deal with the complications of pregnancy.

An important component in the provision of such service is the close availability of a neonatal nursery to the delivery unit. This physical relationship is an essential support for premature or sick babies at birth to provide timely, efficient and effective care. The personnel of the nursery are as dedicated to and qualified for their jobs as the providers in the Maternity Care Centre with whom they must work in concert.

The workspace; unfortunately has not kept pace with the modern approach to maternal care. The space is more crowded since all three Obstetrical units were amalgamated at the RUH site. Also the number of births in Saskatoon has increased by 1000 (about 25%) in the past four years and stands at approximately 4800 deliveries for 2009 – 2010. The introduction of a quality improvement project in 2009 – 2010 for elective caesarean sections has significantly increased the number of women having their surgery on time thus decreasing the chaos and inefficiency in the Maternity Care Centre. Unfortunately, the increased deliveries means an increased number of sick and premature babies are born thus putting more pressure on the Neonatal Nursery. The constant overcapacity of this unit means delays for women needing induction of labor and transfer to other tertiary care sites (for the safety of mom and baby if birth occurs and the baby needs Neonatal care). This means that the women of Saskatoon cannot be guaranteed delivery in their own city and sometimes their own province as we put their safety first. Unfortunately, this also means separating the mother from her own trusted care giver.

A larger, more modern unit would allow us to continue to provide exemplary care, reduce the need for transfer, develop improved approaches to care, attract the best and the brightest of caregivers and serve the pregnant women of Saskatoon and Saskatchewan with dignity and compassion.



## Greetings from CHFS Management

From a child who has taken a collection at their birthday party or through the efforts of a small business hosting a BBQ; whether a corporation engages staff in an annual fundraiser or an individual makes a major personal commitment, every single gift to the Children's Hospital Foundation of Saskatchewan is important.

On occasion, I have been asked as to whether or not this new children's hospital is really needed; or perhaps we could just better utilize what we currently have with a couple of upgrades. My response is answered in questions. "Have you ever needed a Children's Hospital before? What differences are there between adult care practises and those of a child's? Have you slept at your child's bedside at the current hospital facility for days or weeks or months? Can infants or children always use the same medical equipment that we use for adults? Why has Saskatchewan lost pediatric specialists to other provinces?"

In the past year, **Saskatchewan had 32,618 pediatric emergency visits.**

Last year alone, other health regions in Saskatchewan referred **over 2240 babies and children to the Department of Pediatrics.** (That means approximately **an additional 187 children per month** came to receive services at the RUH **from other provincial health regions throughout this province.**)



Sales from across Canada and into the United States have generated over \$ 1,000,000 towards cancer diagnostics and treatment, support and education, advocacy groups, screening centres and local needs in rural centres. Breast Friends graciously donated an amazing \$100,000 which will be directed to pediatric oncology at the new provincial children's hospital.




