Isolettes provide a warm, stable environment for newborn babies who need extra-special care. Your gifts were teamed up with Synergy 8 and the Saskatoon Blades to support a new isolette for the Humboldt District Hospital. This new isolette will accommodate the approximately 35 babies born every year in Humboldt's Obstetrical Unit.

The Indigenous Women's Birth Network aims to increase understanding of culturally secure birth practices. This timely research project will help inform care providers and policy makers about traditional birth practices and ceremonies that will promote healing and cultural security for Indigenous women and their families.

A critically-needed Cardiohelp machine is saving the lives of kids suffering from respiratory failure. It is extremely useful in cases of severe influenza A pneumonia, which often results in children needing to be ventilated, suffering from low oxygen, and spending time in Pediatric Intensive Care.

CP Women's Open

Little hearts in Saskatchewan won big at the CP Women's Open at Wascana Country Club in Regina in August 2018. The CP Has Heart program helped raise a heart-warming \$2 million for the new pediatric cardiology unit at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital. The total donation is the result of several fundraising initiatives, including CP Birdies for Heart where CP contributed \$5,000 for each birdie made by a player on the 17th hole during tournament play. CP also matched all online donations made from February 14th to the end of the tournament.

Theresa Martin

Two private patient rooms in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) bear the name of Theresa Martin, thanks to her generous gift of \$297,000. Martin, who was born premature, was always drawn to care for those who needed a little extra help to heal and grow. The Spiritwood, Sask. resident decided to leave a gift in her will to Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation after listening to the Children's Hospital Radiothon. After Martin passed away at the age of 82, her decision to leave a lasting legacy for Saskatchewan babies and families seemed like the perfect fit for her own family.





Knights of Columbus

The Saskatoon Knights of Columbus #8215 have pledged their support for a maternal patient room and a family comfort room at Saskatchewan's children's hospital.

The faith-based service group raises funds through its annual Knights of Columbus Celebrity Dinner in Saskatoon which has featured Michael "Pinball" Clemons of the Toronto Argonauts and former International Olympic Committee Vice-President Dick Pound. Held on behalf of 11,000 members in Saskatchewan, the event raised \$70,000 in 2018 bringing the five-year total to \$325,125.

The maternal patient room is one of 49 and allows moms-to-be to labour, give birth and stay with their new baby and supportive partner.

Jim Pattison Children's Hospital reached a historic milestone when Graham Construction handed over the keys to the building to the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) exactly on time on May 2, 2019.

More than 1.6 million hours of construction work went into building the 400,000 square foot hospital. The complex process of preparing the building and staff for opening day included moving in over 77,000 pieces of equipment and furniture and the training and orientation of 2,400 staff, plus physicians.

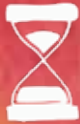
