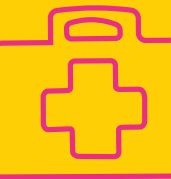

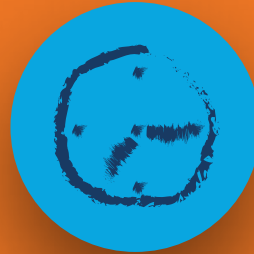

After nearly two decades of dreaming, planning and fundraising, Jim Pattison Children's Hospital officially opened its doors on September 29, 2019, ensuring that Saskatchewan is no longer one of two provinces in Canada not served by a dedicated children's hospital.

You Gave Kids in Hospital an Escape

Hospitals can be scary for any child. To help counter that, the new Jim Pattison Children's Hospital is home to a Family Theatre which gives pediatric patients and their families a fun escape from the reality of illness and medical treatments.

You Brought Music to Kids in Hospital

Young patients at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital have access to a music therapist, who provides musical programming to support the health and well-being of kids in hospital. The music therapy program helps reduce pain, develop positive coping skills and helps with emotional support and self-expression.

You Gave Families the Gift of Time

When parents have children receiving treatment in hospital, they often need short-term supervision for siblings. Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation supports the Child Minding Area, giving parents a chance to focus on their child in hospital, knowing that siblings are cared for with activities such as art projects and games. This space is especially important for out-of-town families who may not have a support network available in Saskatoon.

You Helped Families Cope with the Loss of Their Babies

Empty Arms Prenatal Loss Support services is a program that provides critical support to moms and their families when they experience the loss of a baby. The partnership with this non-profit provides emotional and informational support and guides families through memory-making with their little one, while a professional photographer captures these fleeting and loving moments on film.

You Supported Caregivers of Kids with Mental Health and Addiction Disorders

Caregivers of kids with mental health and addiction disorders often face an increase in poor mental and physical health. To better support them, an interdisciplinary research team is developing and testing a smartphone app to improve caregiver wellness, social connectedness and life satisfaction along with obtaining support to navigate health care services.

Our 2020
Champion Child

The Children's Miracle Network (CMN) Champions Program honours remarkable children across Canada who have triumphed despite severe medical challenges. Each child acts as an ambassador for his or her CMN hospital. In Saskatchewan, Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation is the sole Saskatchewan CMN member.

When Torrie was only nine years old, her life changed forever after receiving a shocking diagnosis of a rare blood disease.

It started in 2016 when she was admitted to hospital in Regina with a low platelet count. Soon after she had no platelet count at all and needed to be airlifted to Saskatoon's Pediatric Intensive Care Unit. Torrie was diagnosed with thrombotic thrombocytopenic purpura (TTP) autoimmune blood disease, which can be fatal or cause lasting damage if not treated right away.


The perfect treatment for Torrie's serious blood disease was a special piece of equipment purchased just six months before her diagnosis. Thanks to the generosity of donors like you, Torrie was the very first child in Saskatchewan to be treated with the new pheresis machine.

Torrie's story took another shocking turn at the start of 2020 when she was diagnosed with lupus, a chronic, autoimmune disease. Learning to cope with two unexpected diseases has not been easy, so Torrie visits a counsellor and a psychiatrist to help her stay positive and manage anxiety. Torrie visits Jim Pattison Children's Hospital every two to three months to see a pediatric hematologist and rheumatologist.

Despite her medical challenges, Torrie remains strong and confident, inspiring all those who meet her.

Major Gifts

Grant McGrath & Family

Grant McGrath, president of Western Sales, along with his family, generously donated \$1 million to support a special school room in the Pediatric Inpatient Unit on the second floor of Jim Pattison Children's Hospital. The school room helps support young learners by giving them a space to continue their studies with as little interruption as possible.

The school room has plenty of resources for kids, including books, computers, tablets, textbooks and other school supplies. The classroom also includes a prominent agricultural mural, which features a red grain elevator in the village of Doddsland, SK. It's a place that holds special meaning for McGrath and his entire family.



Jack Herman

Jack Herman has a big heart for kids and that's why he's supporting pediatric health care in Saskatchewan with a \$1 million gift to Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation. The Maple Creek, SK. native wanted to give back to his home province to help future generations of Saskatchewan families.

"I made this donation because kids who are sick need as much help as we can give them. It must be hard for a child to battle an illness. I just wanted to make things a little better for them," Herman said.

Throughout the Now More Than Ever campaign, Herman generously matched gifts dollar-for-dollar on individual donations, new monthly donations, as well as major gifts up to \$25,000.



CIBC

CIBC has continued their commitment to help families impacted by cancer with a gift of \$250,000. The funding established the new CIBC Pediatric Oncology Family Comfort Fund, which is designed to help Saskatchewan families with children undergoing cancer treatments in the Day Medicine and Pediatric Oncology Unit at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital. The fund helps provide financial support for non-medical and special expenses. CIBC's donation also provides patients with port shirts and oncology-specific medical play equipment such as port access dolls.

In 2015, CIBC also donated \$250,000 to support a treatment room in the Day Medicine and Pediatric Oncology Unit at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital.

Donors from across the province helped raise \$750,109 in two short days at the first-ever province-wide Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Radiothon presented by CIBC Wood Gundy.

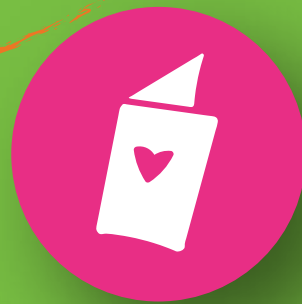
