# Meet our kids

## Meet Rory

Age: 4

Hometown: Saskatoon

Condition: Severe epileptic seizures

“This is where the world had changed forever for our firstborn.”

Rory entered the world on April 1, 2017—a healthy little boy born without any complications, weighing nine pounds and three ounces. As first-time parents, Clayton and Kendall were ecstatic.

For the first three months of Rory’s life, things were going smoothly until one day when Rory started showing some unusual behaviour. His body went limp, his eyes stared off, and his breathing became shallow, all of which lasted for around 30 seconds before returning to normal.

Rory continued to have more episodes, and as his parents prepared to head to the hospital, Rory became totally stiff, his breathing became laboured, and his colour began to change. He was then rushed to pediatric emergency.

“This is where the world had changed forever for our firstborn,” Kendall recalled. “For us as first-time parents, it was beyond devastating, heart wrenching and scary. Our thoughts were going 90 miles an hour, wondering if our son will make it. There are truly no words to describe how scared we were.”

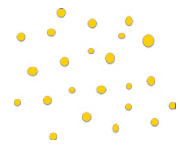
Rory was ultimately diagnosed with a rare form of epilepsy called West Syndrome, also commonly known as infantile spasms. He has since been on countless medications, has had CT scans and MRIs, as well as metabolic and genetic testing. With all the tests that have been completed, the cause for Rory’s condition is currently unknown.

Due to his condition, he has global developmental delay, resulting in Rory being non-verbal, fed via a gastrostomy tube, and being unable to sit or stand unassisted. Currently, his seizure activity consists of drop and absence seizures two to three times a day. Despite Rory’s struggles, the four-year-old has a smile that can light up any room. He loves being a big brother to his little sister, and also enjoys Disney movies, Elmo, reading books and being outside.

Rory continues to make regular visits to Jim Pattison Children’s Hospital for follow-up care.

“We are extremely grateful for everyone who is on Rory’s health care team, and after three years of regular visits, they feel like a second family,” said Kendall. “The doctors and nurses are always going above and beyond to help make sure all treatment plans and procedures are in the best interest of Rory. We, as a family feel well taken care of by the team every time we step into the hospital. It definitely helps to alleviate any of that stress or anxiety we may have. We are so grateful to have such a caring, compassionate and supportive team look after Rory on his journey.”

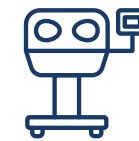

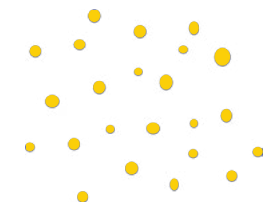
## RBC Race for the Kids

# Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Radiothon

The annual Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Radiothon presented by CIBC Wood Gundy raised over **\$641,157** to support a **new Hemodialysis Unit at Saskatchewan's only maternal and children's hospital**, as well as the **creation of Ambulatory Blood Pressure Monitoring satellite sites across the province.**

**Condition:** NICU/PICU



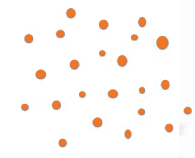
Braxton was born premature and spent 19 days in the NICU. He was only home for a week after that and ended up in the PICU for five days, then the pediatric inpatients for another eight days. He had a scheduled day surgery at 12 months old and another surgery at 13 months which had the family staying overnight in hospital for five days.

"We are so grateful to everyone at the hospital for taking such good care of Braxton and we know we wouldn't be where we are today without them," says Jenn, Braxton's mom. "We are incredibly lucky to have the Children's Hospital and we couldn't be more thankful."



Madeline is 15 years old. She loves hanging out with friends and listening to music, particularly the band, Wallows.

Unfortunately, her first year of high school was rocky. The pressures of social life and the stress of falling behind in school were mounting. Madeline did her best to manage, but discovered that she needed some additional support. It was with her courageous efforts that Madeline continues to work on her self-care and overall wellness.



**Meet Madeline**

**Age:** 15  
**Hometown:** Saskatoon  
**Condition:** Mental Health



**"It felt like the glass underneath me was shattering,"**

Madeline explained.

In January 2020, it led Madeline to the point of attempting suicide. Her mom, Samantha, rushed her to the emergency room in the early hours of the morning, but the resources were not in place to provide her with the treatment she needed.

"When we went to the hospital, I just remember I couldn't focus on anything. My mind was feeling numb. It was really overwhelming," explained Madeline. "I don't want anyone to feel the type of pain I felt that night. It felt so draining. I felt so much pain all over my body and into my chest."

The next day, Madeline saw a mental health intake professional to make an at-home plan, but she said she didn't find much comfort in the experience. Madeline has since found a great source of support from a counselor who works in suicide bereavement, while she waited to see a child and adolescent psychiatrist. Madeline also found support in close friends, family, and different types of coping skills.

"After my experience, it was eye-opening and I started to understand my mental health more. Now I know more about how things affect me, what I was going through at that time, and overall I'm feeling a lot better now," Madeline said.

Mental health challenges are not something new for Madeline's family. Her maternal grandmother struggled with bipolar and drug addiction for years, before taking her own life in 2014. The Saskatoon family hopes that by sharing their story it will continue the conversation around mental health and help to end the stigma.
