



Meet **Nicko** 2023 Champion Child

Canada's Children's Hospital Foundation (CCHF) along with the Children's Miracle Network (CMN) Champions Program honours remarkable children across Canada who have triumphed despite medical challenges. Each child acts as an ambassador for their hospital to demonstrate the personal journey children and their families take to overcome illness and injury.

Dying twice and surviving is not something that most people can brag about. For 17-year-old Nicko, it's a statement he's proud to proclaim.

He was born with spina bifida and hydrocephalus meaning his back was completely open when he was born. At just two days old Nicko underwent his first surgery, a kyphectomy, where three vertebrae were removed. A few days later he underwent his second surgery, placing a shunt tube in his head leading down to his abdomen to drain fluid. The surgeries both resulted in an excessive amount of blood loss, meaning that Nicko's only chance of making a comeback was to fight for his life at only a few days old.

Age: 17 Hometown: Martensville, SK Condition: Spina Bifida & Hydrocephalus The first couple surgeries that he went through were so frightening. The amount of blood loss is what shook us the most, but Nicko is an absolute trooper. We couldn't be more grateful for the specialized care he received during that time.

Now Nicko is 17 and has had six major surgeries, 10 minor procedures, and still visits Saskatchewan's Jim Pattison Children's Hospital regularly. Being a teen who loves history, Nicko has a profound history of his own and doesn't let anything hold him back. Nicko knows there is nothing he can't do, he just might have to find a different way to get there!

Thanks to your generosity, AccuVein vein finders are now available in Jim Pattison Children's Hospital's Children's Emergency Department, Day Medicine and Pediatric Oncology Units, and Pediatric Departments, significantly enhancing intravenous access for pediatric patients and improving medical professionals' ability to visualize small veins.

Vein finders reduce the frequency of needle pokes, resulting in less pain and anxiety for the child. This equipment creates added accuracy and improved delivery of care for our province's children.

Improving Maternal and Pediatric Patient Experience in Rural and Remote Communities

Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation is honoured to partner with the Virtual Care and Robotics Program research lab at the University of Saskatchewan, under the leadership of Dr. Ivar Mendez on an exciting new research initiative. The MELODY Telerobotic Ultrasound System deployed in St. Joseph's Hospital in Gravelbourg, SK, allows a sonographer based at a central location to remotely perform an ultrasound to distant sites, without the expectant mother or patient having to travel long distances to receive the care they need.

In addition to Gravelbourg, the telerobotic ultrasound research initiative has successfully deployed this technology in three northern Indigenous communities, including Stony Rapids, La Loche and Pelican Narrows. The MELODY Telerobotic Ultrasound System is state-of-the-art technology that is shaping the future of virtual care technologies for patients across Saskatchewan.

Easing Barriers for Families in Financial Need

The healing of a child also means supporting the family, as they too are affected in a variety of ways during a hospital stay, including the added expenses that come with it. Through the **Conexus Credit Union Family Amenities** Fund, families have the opportunity to work with their dedicated Social Worker of Interprofessional Practice to apply for financial aid in coping with both the day-to-day and unexpected costs of having a child stay at Saskatchewan's Jim Pattison Children's Hospital.

Through this partnership and your generous donor dollars, you have helped families from over 54 communities across Saskatchewan through this program.



Providing World-Class CPR Training Equipment to Hospital Staff

Your generosity has made annual CPR recertification more accessible to the approximate 900 hard-working JPCH medical professionals, by providing them with their very own set of high-tech CPR training equipment. The infant, child and adult sized mannequins feature feedback devices that give immediate information on the rate, depth and recoil of cardiac compressions, improving each trainee's ability to give high-quality CPR. The new equipment has made CPR training sessions more efficient for nurses, allowing for hands-on CPR training right in JPCH, saving time by having equipment readily available for a greater focus on learning.

Helping Save Little Lives with State-of-the-Art Equipment

Your support has helped fund the state-of-the-art Sonosite SII-Wave Ultrasound System which allows medical teams at the JPCH Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) to provide immediate and safe responses to diagnostic imaging results. It is a valued tool used multiple times a day in the NICU at JPCH, providing quality care ultrasounds that are safe and painless for our tiniest patients.





Bringing Comfort to Children in Need

Thanks to generous JPCHF donors, the addition of a Snoezelen Cart at JPCH has created a safe and soothina environment that helps patients who are struggling with anxiety, need a distraction from pain, or have cognitive challenges that require further stimulation during procedures. The multi-sensory environment of a Snoezelen Cart, including a bubble tube, color-changing lights and mirrors, creates comfort for kids when they need it most. It has been a helpful tool in the Children's Emergency Department, helping children during long wait times and emergency procedures.



Meet Rustyn

Friends and family of six-year-old Rustyn describe her as a positive ray of sunshine. She loves anything girly, being a big sister, and having Taylor Swift dance parties with her mom, Ashlyn. However, things quickly took a turn for the young girl and her family this past May.

Rustyn was struggling to catch her breath more than usual. Her mother Ashlyn, who is a licensed practical nurse, assumed it was asthma. They went to their family doctor in Swift Current, SK, ran some extra tests and took an x-ray so pneumonia could be ruled out. The results led to something much more unexpected – Rustyn had a mass on her lung.

"I swear my soul had left my body by that point. I couldn't hear anything but ringing and thought I was going to throw up and pass out before our nurse, who is also my co-worker and friend, caught me in her arms and we just cried until reality set in," Ashlyn said.

Things moved very quickly from there. Rustyn was airlifted to **Saskatchewan's only Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU)** at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital (JPCH). Rustyn's medical team knew they had a short window to treat the large tumour that was compressing her lungs, as there was a chance for the tumour to break and block her airway.

The next couple of days felt like a blur for Rustyn and her family, as they knew their lives would drastically change. Rustyn was diagnosed with T-cell acute lymphoblastic (T-ALL) leukemia and began immediate treatment.

Rustyn has made her family extremely proud as she takes on her medical journey with bravery and positivity. As Rustyn continues chemotherapy and treatment at JPCH over the next couple of years, her mom says they are incredibly grateful for the life-saving care she is receiving.

The vehicles are fully equipped with health care specialists, dental and mental health programs/treatments. These units have increased access to health care for our kids right across Saskatchewan.



In spring 2023, following a traditional pipe ceremony in the Spiritual Reflection Room at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital, a special event was held with leaders from the Saskatoon Tribal Council who officially presented a handcrafted star blanket to Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation. The star blanket, intricately woven with meaningful symbolism, represents the interconnectedness of all living things and carries the prayers and well wishes of the Indigenous communities it represents. The blanket is proudly displayed in the main corridor within the hospital, serving as a tangible embodiment of the partnerships' shared values, aspirations, and respect.

Meet Theo

Kaylene and Gabe from Regina, SK were thrilled to welcome their second son in January 2023. After a smooth delivery, Theo came into the world with medical complexities that required immediate attention at JPCH.

"We were overcome with so many emotions, especially fear and confusion. Would our little Theo be okay? Could he see? Could he hear? Could he breathe?" Gabe remembers about the moment Theo was born.

Theo was taken to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and it became apparent the newborn would need specialized care. Theo was diagnosed with Treacher Collins syndrome, a craniofacial disorder that affects the development of bone and tissue in the head and face. The most critical feature is the underdeveloped jaw, which can block off the airway.

In the days that followed, the condition of Theo's airway worsened and there were many moments where he stopped breathing. Theo was eventually airlifted to Saskatchewan's Jim Pattison Children's Hospital (JPCH).

The young family spent the next eight weeks in the JPCH NICU and worked with many specialists, including a Pediatric ENT, plastic surgeon, respirologist, complex care team, social workers and dieticians. Theo received his Tracheostomy surgery in February, followed by a G-tube surgery in March.

Kaylene and Gabe were terrified that Theo's condition would be too complex for a Saskatchewan hospital, but say the environment and incredible care he received reassured them that JPCH was where Theo needed to be. Today, Theo is a happy, cheeky little boy who loves watching his older brother Arthur dance and spending time with the family dog, Ivy. While having a child with a complex medical condition can be challenging, Gabe says being Theo's parents has given their family a deeper understanding and appreciation of life and love.


THANK YOU SASKATCHEWAN!
